Call for Papers

We are pleased to announce the Call for Papers for this joint conference of TU Dortmund and TU Darmstadt to be held from March 27th to 28th, 2019, at Dortmund, Germany.

The 4th ICPLT aims to identify trends and challenges for commercial transport as the essential link for production, logistics and society. Therefore, innovative technologies and strategies should be presented and discussed to better understand the interdependencies and conflicts of interest between the areas of production, logistics and traffic.

Experts in the above mentioned fields are invited to submit their contributions as an abstract.

The deadline for abstract submission is June **30th, 2018**. Abstracts should be sent to icplt2019@itl.tu-dortmund.de.

Paper abstracts (**max. 3,500 characters without spaces**), giving a concise overview of the topics to be covered and the method of analysis, should include the following brief sections:

(1) overview, (2) methods, (3) results, (4) conclusions and (5) references. Besides this information, the abstract should include the name of the author(s), affiliation, e-mail address, title of the contribution and keywords. The corresponding author submitting the abstract must provide complete contact details, i.e. postal address, e-mail address, phone and fax.

The abstracts will be assessed by the scientific committee within a double-blind-review. Authors will be notified by August 31st, 2018 of their abstract status.

Authors whose abstracts are accepted will have to submit their full papers (max. 15 pages) until October 31st, 2018. Then, the scientific committee will review the content and the quality of the full papers. The selected full papers will be published in a conference proceeding by Springer-Verlag.

We welcome submissions from advanced experts in this field and encouraged PhD students to contribute to a successful conference. We expect abstracts generally in English (aber deutsche Beiträge sind ebenso möglich) and are looking forward to receiving your outstanding abstract and getting the opportunity to welcome you in Dortmund in **March 2019**.

- Commercial transport
- Supply chain and supply network management
- Intermodal transport and logistics hubs
- Freight transport demand modelling
